



SITE NARRATIVE

SECTION AA 1:300 Customs St E & Fort Lane Intersection, Auckland CBD










Atmosphere created through material testing and experimentation of light and shadow with consideration to the linear journey and experience to enhance public life on site.








MOON GATES: THRESHOLDS





MAGNOLIA DENODATA


